

Maryville City Council
Special Meeting
October 6, 2008

The Council of the City of Maryville, Missouri, met in special session on Monday, October 06, 2008, at 5:30 p.m., at City Hall, 415 North Market Street, in said City.

ROLL CALL

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jackson and the roll was called by the City Clerk, with the following present to-wit: Mayor Chad Jackson, Council Members Carole Coutts, Patricia Cummings, Ronnie Moss, Michael Thompson. Others present were City Manager Matt LeCerf and City Clerk Sheila Smail.

DISCUSSION: COMMITTEE MEMBER TO SEARCH OF A NEW PRESIDENT AT NWMSU

Mayor Jackson informed the Council that he had received a letter from Northwest Missouri State University requesting that a representative of the City be appointed to the search committee being established for locating a new president of the university.

Councilman Thompson stated that he had spoken to Councilman Moss, encouraging him to accept the role of said committee.

Councilman Moss stated that he would be willing to serve in that capacity.

Thereupon motion was made by Councilman Thompson, seconded by Councilwoman Cummings, to appoint Councilman Moss as a representative of the city to serve on the committee searching for a new president of the university. Upon roll being called, the vote was as follows: Councilman Thompson, yea; Councilman Moss, yea; Councilwoman Coutts, yea; Councilwoman Cummings, yea, Mayor Jackson, yea. Motion carried.

REQUEST TO HOLD NWMSU HOMECOMING PARADE ON CITY STREETS

City Manager LeCerf stated that a request had been made by Northwest Missouri State University, to hold the Homecoming Parade on city streets, on Saturday, October 18, 2008. He explained that the route would begin on campus, exiting off University Drive onto West Fourth Street, traveling east

to North Main Street, dispersing as they go north on Main Street. The parade will end a block sooner than normal because of the construction at East Fourth Street and North Market Street.

Thereupon motion was made by Councilwoman Cummings, seconded by Councilwoman Coutts, that Northwest Missouri State University, be allowed to hold the traditional Homecoming Parade on city streets. Upon roll being called, the vote was as follows: Councilman Moss, yea; Councilwoman Coutts, yea; Councilwoman Cummings, yea; Councilman Thompson, yea; Mayor Jackson, yea. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Councilwoman Cumming, seconded by Councilman Thompson, that the meeting be adjourned.
